KMCB has partnered with the Montgomery County Master Gardener Association which is growing the plants and will participate in the educational programs.

This year's native plant is Rudbeckia Goldstrum (black-eyed susan) in 4" pots for \$5.00 each.

Goals of Growing Green Plant Sale:

- * Raise money to fund KMCB's grant program (grants will fund environmental and beautification projects in Montgomery County)
- * Publicize Montgomery County recycling centers
- * Educate about native plants, recycling, sustainability and low impact events
- * Demonstrate how to hold a low or no impact event (combine trips - pick up plants while recycling; plants are in peat pots rather than plastic)
